- HIS 7830, Methods and Research in History (3 cr.)
- HIS 7999, Master's Essay (3 cr.)
- At least one 8000-level History seminar (3 cr.), taken after completing HIS 7830
- HIS electives (14 cr.)
 - No more than two (2) courses may be taken at the 5000- or 6000-level without permission of the advisor and DGS (granted by their signatures on the Plan of Work);
 5000- and 6000-level courses must be offered for graduate credit to count toward the MA degree
- INF electives (7 cr.)
