Dean Whitehouse,

May I call your attention to the fact that our assistant in psychology is getting only thirty cents (30 cents) per hour, when others, working on the N.Y.A., are getting more, yet doing much less specialized work.

Our present assistant, Mrs. Bohr, has not complained. I, myself, did not know that, in general, the pay of student assistants had been raised. It seems to me that, in the light of these facts and the fact that our assistant seldom gets pay for all the hours that he or she puts in, this pay per hour should be increased.

I hope that request will meet with your approval. Even if we are unable to raise the pay of our present assistant, certainly next year the pay should be increased. We hope that something may be done for the present assistant.
